SECP Registration: Established in 2015, MERF is registered with Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan under Section 42 of Companies Act 2017 (Previously Companies Ordinance 1984).

FBR Registration: MERF is a certified not-for-profit organization (NPO) under Section 2(36) of Income Tax Ordinance 2001 with National Tax Number (NTN) 7212843-0. **Provincial Tax Authorities:** MERF is registered with provincial tax authorities in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Sindh, Baluchistan and Punjab as withholding agent as per relevant provincial laws.

PCP Certification: MERF is certified by Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP), which is certification body for non-government organizations working in Pakistan.

EAD MOU for foreign funding: MREF has a valid MOU with Economic Affairs Division (EAD), Government of Pakistan, as per applicable laws for NGOs receiving foreign contribution. **NOCs for working in NMDs - KP:** MERF has valid No Objection Certificates (NOCs) for implementation of projects in Newly Merged Districts (NMDs) of the KP including Orakzai, Mohmand, Kurram and South Waziristan. Due to valid NOCs for NMDs, NOCs for further locations is processed quickly.

NOCs for working in Balochistan: MERF has valid No Objection Certificates (NOCs) for implementation of projects in multiple districts of Baluchistan which currently includes Quetta, Kalat and Surab. In the past, it has implemented projects in more than 18 districts of Balochistan.

Our Thematic Areas

Health



MERF focuses on strengthening the public health system to deliver quality integrated healthcare services that addresses the key burden of communicable & non-communicable diseases and problems related to the Maternal, Newborn and Child Healthcare. The major interventions that MERF implemented across its projects include;

- Providing essential curative and preventive services & through primary and secondary healthcare facilities through collaboration under Public –
 Private Partnerships
- Providing necessary Human Resource (Specialists, Medical Doctors and Paramedical Staff)
- Strengthening health information system

Nutrition



MERF focuses on providing nutrition specific interventions that address the immediate determinants of maternal and child under nutrition. The key interventions include:

Community mobilization and screening of malnourished children and pregnant women

- Supplementary feeding program (SFP)
- Outpatient therapeutic program (OTP)
- Management Severe Acute Malnourished (SAM) cases in Stabilization Center
- Promotion of infant and young child feeding practices, multi micro-nutrient supplementation and de-worming

Emergency Response



MERF Emergency Response always collaborative effort at field and facilities level are the core of all efforts during emergencies. MERF ensures that in case of any emergency like floods or epidemics, contingency plans are in place to control infectious diseases and other health issues of concern in emergencies - man made or natural. MERF response include:

- Emergency Medical camps
- Nutrition in emergencies
- Ration & livelihoods distributions
- Cash for Work or Cash Based Transfers

WASH



WASH is essential for children and their families to live healthy lives. Typical diseases and conditions associated with lack of WASH include, diarrhea, malnutrition and stunting. Diarrhea and malnutrition are leading causes of child mortality and morbidity in Pakistan. MERF focuses on the following

- Provision of safe drinking water to communities, schools and healthcare facilities.
- Providing appropriate facilities for defecation including establishment of public latrines.
- Conducting awareness sessions on handwashing, use of latrines and importance of following other hygienic practices.

Research & Studies



MERF has qualified professional and dedicated survey and research teams at the country office as well as at provincial level. This includes health experts, Bio statistician, M&E professional and sector specialist. The team holds hands on experience on SQUEAC, KAP and SMART surveys. Recently the team conducted NNS-17 survey in 11 districts of Balochistan and in 06 districts of KPK

HRD for Health



To enhance training and capacity building in healthcare system MERF has been working to train local staff in the most remote areas of the country. Midwifery courses, nursing diplomas and several other certifications and trainings are conducted to strengthen skills, knowledge and resources that increase from capacity building efforts

Ongoing Projects:

Hospital Services in Newly Merged Districts (NMDs) in 02 DHQ and 05 THQ Hospitals - on Public Private Partnership Basis

The Government of KP through KP health department and KP Heath Foundation has taken the initiative of Health System Strengthening (HSS) by engaging private sector organizations on public private partnership basis in NMDs. MERF has made all the hospitals fully functional and is providing free of cost services including general and specialized OPD services, IPD services (Surgical, Medical, Pediatrics, Gynecology & Eye), A&E Services, OT services, Labor rooms, Diagnostic services, pharmacy and EPI services with responsibility of operationalization, management and provision of secondary health services to the general public. ECHO HIP 2022 in Balochistan

The project supported by IRC, implemented by MERF is responding to the most immediate needs through integrated protection, health services and multipurpose cash assistance to flood-affected communities in two districts of Balochistan — Killa Abdullah and Chaman. The interventions align with IRC ENI findings, response interventions prioritized by the National and Provincial Disaster Management Authorities (NDMA/PDMAs) and Global Humanitarian Standards such as Sphere standards, IASC MHPSS, Gender Based Violence Minimum Standards (GBVMS) and Child Protection Minimum Standards. The proposed project aimed to ensure that:



- People's basic needs are met, and their livelihoods are protected through Multi-Purpose Cash Assistance (MPCA) to 1700 families.
- Affected populations access quality essential health services to prevent and reduce excess mortality and morbidity through 12 mobile health camps, rehabilitation of 6 health facilities and provision of medicines and commodities.
- Quality Child Protection and GBV in Emergencies through provision of services such as Mental Health Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) are safe and accessible for women, girls and boys, community outreach and information dissemination activities, distribution of dignity kits for women and girls of reproductive age, and establishing multi-sectoral referral pathways in targeted districts.



Management of 15 Health Facilities in Peshawar supported by Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation

Under this project MERF operationalized 15 dispensaries in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa to provide free of cost primary & preventative care services to all patients. The facilities primarily focus on MNCH services - specifically antenatal care, deliveries, postnatal care, nutrition, and immunization services. The provision of this sort of integrated package of health services helps in reaching families that may otherwise refuse OPV during door-to-door polio vaccination campaigns, and will help boost routine immunization coverage in the communities in coverage area.

The project is benefitting the underserved & at-risk communities of the Super High Risk Union Councils (SHRUCs) in Peshawar.

Peshawar has historically been one of the core reservoirs for Poliovirus in Pakistan, and these SHRUCs are Peshawar's poorest areas, as is evident by high levels of childhood malnutrition and lower rates of immunization coverage prevalent in these areas. Prior to this intervention, dispensaries in these union councils were not operational





and the local communities were suffering because of lack of other affordable options.

Government General Hospital, Nishtarabad Peshawar under KPHCIP supported by the World Bank

MERF has been managing specialized hospital in Nishtarabad since June 2020. This is a dedicated COVID 19 hospital that is providing specialized COVID 19 related services to patients from all across the province. It has been established by MERF with support of European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (ECHO) funding through International Rescue Committee (IRC) in June, 2021. The hospital has been equipped with latest medical equipment and has capacity of 100 beds with 50 beds for Isolation, 30 beds for HDU and 20 beds for ICU COVID 19 patients.

- The hospital is providing the following services,
- Quality Covid-19 Health services i.e. Isolation, High Dependency Unit
 & Intensive care unit for COVID-19 patients.
- COVID Vaccination services for the community.
- Establishment of state of the art Hepatology Unit to provide management services (diagnostic & treatment) for Hepatitis A, B & C.
- Establishment of CEmONC and Breast Cancer Screening Unit in the hospital
- Availability of skilled Human Resource, essential medicines, and functional equipment.
- Availability of Public Health lab, diagnostics, waste management, infection prevention & control, referral linkages with other hospitals and all necessary support services



Social mobilization and community outreach activities to promote routine/essential immunization in 15 target districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

Under this UNICEF funded program MERF will identify and strengthen the existing community-based entities and will engage them with stakeholders engaged in immunization at both Union Council and district level for effective community engagement and community mobilization in order to enable the communities to increase demand for immunization services in target 15 districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. MERF will develop evidence-based plans for each target union council focusing on gender equality, health systems strengthening and capacity building in order create convergence for enhancement of vaccination coverages. MERF will also disseminate key messages on COVID 19 preventive measures and SOPs during ACSM interventions.

- Project will carry out rapid social mapping/profiling to assess and address social and behavioral issues in target districts and use the information for evidence-based planning and implementation of community engagement interventions.
- Project will identify factors for zero dose, missed newborn birth dose, and defaulters. Also, existing or establish new community structures/committees will be identified to utilize them to create demand for routine immunization services and address refusals within communities. Identify refusals for routine immunization and polio for referrals to EPI centers.
- Human Resource engaged in social mobilization and community
 outreach for improved uptake of the essential immunization at both
 district and union council levels will work in close coordination with
 department of health and community level influencers to as fulcrum
 for identification of determinants and then awareness raising through
 IEC material placement and dissemination, Public Service
 Announcements (PSAs), social networks like WhatsApp, for effecting
 social change in target union councils.

Ongoing Project:

Stunting Prevention in Balochistan under Benazir Nashonuma Program

MERF is implementing Stunting Prevention Programme in Balochistan under Benazir -Nashonuma Stunting Prevention Programme supported by World Food Programme. In 20 most needed districts of Balochistan.

Through the Nashonuma Stunting Prevention Programme, BISP has designed a Conditional Cash Transfer intervention to increase the uptake of health and nutrition services by its beneficiaries





through facilitation centers (FCs) established under the Programme. MERF is responsible for operationalization and management of FCs, ensuring provision of health and nutrition services to the beneficiary and outreach activities to ensure maximum coverage.

Recently incepted projects in Sindh & Balochistan focusing Nutrition in Emergencies:

Nutrition Emergency Response in Flood Affected Districts of Sindh funded by UNICEF

This recent project in districts of Dadu ,, Qamber Shahdadkot, Badin, Thatta, Sujawal , Jackobabad and Kashmore in Sindh have been outlined to improve the access of severely malnourished children to life saving interventions through implementation of simplified approaches for wasting management and to avert the compromised nutritional status besides improving the access of vulnerable children (boys and girls), adolescent girls and PLW to nutritional supplements and information needed to preclude the risks associated with malnutrition.

Nutrition Integrated Flood and Calamity Hit Response in Districts of Balochistan funded by UNICEF

The project incepted in district of in Jhal Magsi, Khuzdar, Pishin, and Kachi in Balochistan focused on already prevailing malnutrition issue become severe due to floods and remote locations in province.

Strengthening Local Civil Society and Community-based Organizations and their Capacity in the Nutrition Sector in Sindh

This upcoming EU funded 24-month action supported through IRC aims to address the needs and issues of malnutrition in five districts Kashmore, Ghotki, Sukkur, Khairpur, and Nosheroferoze of Pakistan's north Sindh (Annex 2). It will enhance local civil society organizations' internal and networking capacity to lead the advocacy and policy dialogue at the provincial level, improve facility-based treatment, and increase community outreach. The action will map out the CSOs in the target districts,

Completed Project:

EU Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh (PINS) - Nutrition Stabilization Centers

MERF as IP of Action Against Hunger (ACF) is implementing EU PINs nutrition specific component in District Thatta and Sujawal and has established Nutrition Stabilization Centers in DHQ Hospital Makli Thatta and THQ Hospital Sujawal. The objectives of the project are

- Treatment of Malnutrition
- Referral system for follow up of children
- IYCF for preventive work at facilitates specially for children with MAM
- BCC for improved nutrition







ECHO- HIP 2016 - Health and Nutrition Services

MERF responded to ECHO HIP 2016 call and was awarded contract as implementing partner of Malteser International to provide health and nutrition services to TDPs and host population of KP including Newly Merged Districts. Under the project, MERF provided Primary Healthcare Services with a focus on maternal, newborn and child health in 15 HFs and CMAM Services (Screening, SFP, OTP & December 2017).

Pakistan floods 2022 - Emergency Response:

Pakistan has received unprecedented monsoon rainfall since the start of the monsoon season. Heavy rains have resulted in urban and flash floods, landslides, and Glacial Lake Outburst Floods (GLOF) across Pakistan, particularly affecting Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and Sindh Provinces.

Nationwide, 80 districts have been officially notified as 'calamity hit' – 31 in Balochistan, 23 in Sindh, 17 in KP, six in GB and three in Punjab. Many more districts without an official declaration are also reportedly impacted. Around 33 million people have been affected by the heavy rains and flooding, according to the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA). 637,000 people are living in relief camps, while many more are displaced and being hosted by other households (OCHA-06 September 2022). MERF immediately started responding to the emergency and activated its emergency response protocols. MERF is responding to Floods Emergency in the following way;

- General Food Distribution supported by World Food Programme
- Humanitarian Action (Medical Camps) for the Flood Affected Communities of Balochistan supported by
- SIDA/IRC
- Medical Camps and Rehabilitation of Health Facilities supported by ECHO/IRC
- Medical Camps in KP

Cash Based Transfers (CBT) for flood affected families of Balochistan funded by WFP:

Improve the food security and livelihoods situation of flood-affected communities by restoring their livelihoods and building resilience through agriculture and community infrastructure support. MERF supported households in Naseerabad district of Balochistan Province. Each selected beneficiary received PKR. 12,000/- unconditional cash assistance, in close coordination with WFP.

Integrated Humanitarian Assistance for Vulnerable Afghan Refugees and Emergency affected population (I-HAVE) in Balochistan & Sindh funded by ECHO through

IRC

MERF, with support from European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (ECHO) and International Rescue Committee (IRC), is providing comprehensive emergency obstetric care, emergency referrals, and nutrition services in the far flung districts of Chaman and Killa Abdullah of Balochistan. The purpose of this project is to facilitate people of these targeted districts in both the provinces through providing cash assistance, child protection and psychosocial support for prevention of Gender based violence. This MR will extend lifesaving and early recovery assistance to flood affected communities (both Afghan refugees and hosts communities fulfilling the criteria) through integrated protection, health, Cash for Work (CfW) and education services. in Khairpur and Dadu in Sindh children identified and screened as SAM or MAM, administered BMG dose and Penta-3, IYCF and maternal nutrition sessions conducted.

The intervention is aligned with IRC's recent Early Recovery Needs Identification (ERNI) findings. Response interventions are prioritized by the National and PDMAs and Global Humanitarian Standards (Sphere standards, IASC MHPSS, GBV, INEE and Child Protection Minimum Standards).

Completed Projects:

COVID-19 Emergency Response: Containing Spread of COVID-19 through Strengthening of Health Facilities, Case management, Testing and Risk Communication

Under ECHO funding for COVID-19 Emergency Response, MERF in collaboration with International Rescue Committee (IRC) is responding to the emergency in order to contain the spread of COVID-19 and strengthen the existing capacities of health system in Pakistan. Under the project, MERF;

Supports 03 isolation facilities, one each in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Sindh and Balochistan to manage suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases.

- Has establish 03 Intensive Care Units (ICU) in Karachi,
 Quetta and Peshawar for managing complicated cases. In
 Peshawar, 100 bed hospital equipped with Ventilators,
 BIPAP machines and centrally oxygen linked ICU beds is
 managed by MERF.
- Has strengthen designated laboratory services in Peshawar, Quetta and Karachi to screen and confirm COVID-19 cases through provision of PCR Tests. Moreover, PCR Labs have been established in Peshawar and Karachi.
- Provides Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services (MHPSS) during COVID -19 outbreak response.

Augmenting COVID-19 Vaccination Coverage in District Peshawar, KP

The aim of this project is to enhance COVID -19 vaccine coverage in district Peshawar to save lives of vulnerable population

by improving their immunity against COVID-19 through support of International Medical Corps (IMC).

Specific objectives/results of the intervention include the following:

- Improved access of registered individuals to vaccination services through static and mobile vaccination facilities.
- Enhanced knowledge and attitude of hesitant individuals and communities by enabling them to access scientifically accurate information on COVID-19

Project achieved quite good coverage of the vaccination across Peshawar district beside awareness and advocacy through outdoor media like billboards and banners throughout the city at strategically selected locations. As of November 2021, following number of people are vaccinated through the program in Peshawar District of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:

ECHO - Strengthening Healthcare and Nutrition in Emergencies (SHiNE)

This 14-months program is designed to strengthen primary healthcare services and nutrition for vulnerable populations of 2 Newly Merged Districts (NMDs) of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP); namely, South Waziristan and Orakzai and will strengthen the response and coordination among humanitarian actors in Pakistan. IRC will work in partnership with MERF and Pakistan Humanitarian Forum (PHF). The project contributed towards achieving the following results:

- Increased accessibility and availability of essential, lifesaving and quality health care services for beneficiaries in targeted districts
- Improved nutritional status of children < 5 and Pregnant & Lactating Women (PLW) through Community-based Management of Acute Malnutrition (CMAM) and Infant and Young Child Feeding in Emergencies (IYCF-E) programs in the targeted districts.
- The response to humanitarian and development needs in Pakistan is strengthened through improved coordination, advocacy, information and knowledge management.

COVID-19 Response – Risk Communication & Community Engagement

MERF responded to COVID-19 emergency at its initial phase with support from UNICEF. The challenges posed by spread of COVID-19 required an effective response. Risk communication and community engagement were key components of preparedness and response plan on COVID-19. Therefore, as the virus started spreading in the month of March in Pakistan, UNICEF designed a community awareness and engagement project in selected districts of KP with high incidence of COVID-19 cases. The main objectives of the intervention were to:


- Ensured that the outbreak of COVID-2019 is contained through timely response.
- Provided support to high-risk district health authorities / Departments of Health to prioritize risk communication and community engagement activities and its implementation.





Quetta Urban Survey

The Quetta Urban Survey being carried out by MERF is a multi-purpose household survey that aims to obtain detailed information on the quality of living and access to basic services and infrastructure in urban spaces. This includes a range of themes such as water and sanitation, solid waste management, urban poverty, gender issues, labour market participation and economic empowerment, domestic and international migration, as well as individual aspirations.



National Nutrition Survey 2018

MERF as implementing partner of The Aga khan University carried out data collection under National Nutrition Survey 2018 in 31 districts of Balochistan and KP including NMDs. The project was completed in February 2019.



The survey was conducted in 16 districts of Balochistan on behalf of Department of Health, Government of Balochistan with funding and direct supervision of UNICEF. The surveys were aimed to assess malnutrition and its risk factors which contribute towards the high malnutrition rate. A total of 23,000 HHs were covered in the survey and it was completed in 2017.

Home based Workers Survey in Balochistan:

Home-Based Workers Survey conducted by MERF under The World Bank grant in two districts of Baluchistan namely Quetta and Kharan from Nov 2021.to Jan 2023. MERF teams surveyed door to door for data collection in both the district under very difficult conditions to access the livelihoods and other reverent indication to fulfil the objective of this survey.





Health Skills training for (erstwhile) FATA women

Completed in 2018, the program trained 320 women from (erstwhile) FATA in 06 months' health skills training program through skills centers located in Khyber. The training course comprised of Maternal Health, Nutrition, Family Planning/Birth spacing, Child Health, Immunization and Home-based Care for common illnesses.



Nursing Degree Programme for (erstwhile) FATA Women

In order to meet the shortage of female health workforce in (erstwhile) FATA, MERF under its skills development program with support from FATA-DA is implementing a 04 years nursing program recognized by Pakistan Nursing Council for FATA women. Under this program, 100 female students (Fata residents) were selected who are now undergoing a 04 years nursing program. The program will be completed in September 2020 and would provide much needed health workforce in the region.



Community Midwifery Course for (erstwhile) FATA Women

Under its skills development program with support from FATA-DA, MERF selected and trained 100 female students who were residents of (erstwhile) FATA in 18 months Community Midwifery Course recognized by Pakistan Nursing Council. The project was completed in 2018.



Capacity Building for Rational Use of Drugs

This training aimed to provide policy document for rational use of drugs requires that patients receive medicines appropriate to their clinical needs, in doses that meet their own individual requirements, for an adequate period of time, and at the lowest cost to them and the community.

Long Lasting Insecticidal Nets (LLINs) Mass Distribution in 14 district of Pakistan for

Malaria Prevention 2022

LLIN mass distribution campaign aims to reduce malaria morbidity and mortality through achieving universal coverage, and consistent and correct use of LLINs by the households in the targeted districts.

MERF partnered with the Directorate of Malaria Control- DoMC (Ministry of National Health Services, Regulation and Coordination), Indus Hospital and Health Network (IHHN) and under the slogan of 'Zero Malaria Starts with Me'.

The campaign ensured that 100% of the targeted households mobilized to participate in the campaign and that correct Social & Behavioral Change (SBC) messages are passed consistently during each phase of campaign. The campaign covered 1,129,285 households (HH) living in the target districts during the HH registration and for net distribution.

The Government of Pakistan is conducting a mass distribution campaign of Long-Lasting Insecticidal Nets (LLIN) in 18 targeted districts in Baluchistan including worst flood affected districts, 2 in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and one in Sindh. These districts have been selected on the basis of their high endemic status. The aim of the campaign is to ensure maximum protection of individuals from mosquito bites by distributing bed nets free of costs, to all families in rural areas of the selected districts.
